



Botox Injections for Migraines Discharge Instructions

Summary of Procedure:

A series of Botox injections were administered to specific areas of the head and neck to help reduce the frequency and severity of migraines. Botox works by blocking the release of chemicals involved in pain transmission, providing relief from chronic migraines.

Following the Procedure:

- **Temporary Relief:** You may start to feel the effects of the Botox within a few days, but it may take up to 2 weeks to achieve its full effect.
- **Numbness or Weakness:** Some patients may experience mild numbness or muscle weakness. Take extra care when engaging in physical activities to reduce the risk of injury. Do not drive or operate machinery for the remainder of the day.
- **Activity Restrictions:** Avoid heavy lifting or strenuous activity for the next 24-48 hours.
- **Injection Site Care:** If there is soreness at the injection sites, a cold compress or ice pack applied for a few minutes may help. Slight bruising or tenderness is normal. You may remove the dressing/band-aid from the sites in 24 hours.
- **Medication and Diet:** Resume your usual medications as previously prescribed and continue your normal diet.

When to Contact Us or Your Physician:

- **Fever** greater than 101 degrees Fahrenheit
- **Persistent, severe headache**
- **Excessive redness, warmth, or discharge** at the injection sites
- **Neck stiffness**
